## **SURVEY OBJECTIVE**



#### SURVEY BACKGROUND

The Let's Work Partnership (LWP) emerged from the findings of a World Bank Report on Jobs (2013) and similar studies by the IFC. The goal is to harness the potential for public institutes to work with the private sector in creating "more, better and inclusive" jobs.


Among other strategies, one of the methods proposed was to develop and implement tools to measure, understand and strengthen the creation of more and better jobs. The **Jobs** in **Value Chains Survey** is an outcome of this strategy.



#### **OBJECTIVE OF THE JOBS IN VALUE CHAINS SURVEY**

#### Two Objectives:

- Jobs Estimation
- Analysis/Development of the Value Chain



#### Value chain studies help us understand:

- The number of jobs
- Where they are located in the VC
- Extent and nature of relationships
- among actors in a VC





#### OBJECTIVE OF THE JOBS IN VALUE CHAINS SURVEY

- To generate a full mapping of all critical components of the specified value chain;
- To assess the **enterprise-level dynamics of value chain interactions**, labor use, and the drivers of firm growth, investment, and job creation;
- To **stimulate systematic policy dialogue** on the business environment and to help shape the agenda for reform; and
- To build a cross section (and potentially a panel) of enterprise data that will make it possible to analyze and compare dynamics across value chains and locations (and potentially over time).



## INTERVIEWER TASKS & OBLIGATIONS



#### **INTERVIEWER TASKS & OBLIGATIONS**

An interviewer's work is, with no doubt, one of the most important tasks in this survey.

Coverage, quality and accuracy of information mainly depend on whether the interviewer does his/her job well, is responsible and cooperative!





#### **INTERVIEWER TASKS & OBLIGATIONS**

Data collection will last <XXX> months. All Interviewers will have to make themselves available during this period.

Interviewers will be responsible for:

- Making contact with the selected farms/firms to arrange to interview
- Filling questionnaires for each interviewed farm/firm

An interviewer's tasks, functions and obligations cannot be delegated to another person



#### **INTERVIEWER TASKS**

- To participate actively in and to complete this training course
- To be very familiar with the structure of the questionnaires and with each question
- To study & comply with instructions in the Interview Manual and recommendations contained in the Manual and any instruction given by the Survey Management Team
- To carry out interviews though personal visits to farms/firm to directly collect information





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#### INTERVIEWER TASKS (cont'd.):

- To visit the farm/firm as many times as necessary in order to interview the appropriate respondent, to correct inaccurate information or to complete incomplete information.
  - An interviewer must make him/herself fully available for work in the survey, thus he/she must be available for carrying out the survey at any time the respondent specifies as the most convenient.
- During the interview, to behave professionally in accordance with the important work he/she performs

#### **INTERVIEWER TASKS** (cont'd.):

- To visit the farm/firm in clean and professional attire, having in mind that it is an important aspect for ensuring cooperation from the farm/firm and collecting good quality data
- To hand over to the supervisor all completed questionnaires
   with properly obtained information, every day or as instructed
- To **perform all scheduled interviews** at the time they are planned.
  - If it is not possible to interview any selected farm/firm, the interviewer should inform his/her supervisor, who will make a decision on the necessary approaches (re-visits or changes) in accordance with established procedures.





#### WHAT THE INTERVIEWER MUST NOT DO:



- 1. The work of the interviewer is individual and cannot be transferred to anybody else.
  - No one else can do the interviewer's work
- 2. No one involved in the survey (interviewer, supervisor, data entry operator) can be engaged in any other job during the survey.
  - Work on the survey is a full-time job throughout the duration of the survey
- 3. The interviewer is not allowed to amend any information obtained from the respondent.
  - Information given by the respondent cannot be changed



#### WHAT THE INTERVIEWER MUST NOT DO:



- 4. The interviewer must not disclose, repeat or comment on information obtained from the respondent, nor show completed questionnaires to any other person except his/her supervisor or other project staff
  - Remember that information given by the respondent is strictly confidential
- 5. Do not bring anybody who is not a work team member to interviews with respondents
  - Information given by the respondent is <u>strictly confidential</u>



#### WHAT THE INTERVIEWER MUST NOT DO:



- 6. The interviewer is not allowed to select on his/her own a reserve farm/firm to interview
  - Only the Field Supervisor can authorize a reserve farm/firm



#### **MATERIALS FOR THE INTERVIEWER:**


ID card provided by the firm

List and addresses of **farms/firms** to be interviewed,

Letter to the farm/firm requesting cooperation,

Electronic Copy of the Questionnaire, and

Instruction manual.





#### FLOW OF MATERIALS & REPORTS

The interviewer will hand over to his/her supervisor the properly filled questionnaires and detailed reports including the following:

Summary of results of conducted interviews:

- Number of filled questionnaires,
- List of WORKPLACES which:
  - could not be located,
  - are no longer used
  - have partly or completely refused
- The same report should include the number of used reserve farms/firms approved by the supervisor from the list of reserves

Any issue or problem faced in the field, e.g. in terms of

- Maps
- Enterprise identification
- Incomplete questionnaires
- Respondents behavior and opinion
- Scheduled subsequent visits
- Absent respondents, etc.

In order to resolve problems in the field

 Any other observation for which the interviewer thinks that the supervisor should be informed for the sake of successful work



#### **CONCEPTS & MAIN DEFINITIONS**

- **Direct interview:** Procedure by which information is collected directly from a person. The person giving information is the "respondent".
- Establishment: For this project, the unit of analysis is the 'establishment', which may include formal and informal businesses and farms.
- Workplace: For the Jobs in VC survey, the workplace is defined as a branch, plant, unit, etc. of a larger parent company or firm that has a distinct physical location. The parent company or firm can have multiple workplaces of various sizes in different locations.



#### SURVEY METHODOLOGY & PROCEDURES

#### Sampling:

- The survey sample size will be determined by the value chain mapping for each product of interest.
- The sample of farms/firms will be selected from a list such as an enterprise list, or will come as a result of the interviews within the Value Chain.
- For enterprises that have multiple branches or chains, since we wish to interview WORKPLACES, the final sample list will contain a random selection of these branches/workplaces.



#### **SURVEY METHODOLOGY & PROCEDURES**

#### Sampling

#### INTERVIEW TECHNIQUE

- Plan sufficient time for the interview
- The interviewer should not give impression that he/she considers him/herself an important person because of the assignment he/she performs on behalf of <NAME OF FIRM>.
- It is important that the interviewer has a **friendly attitude** towards the respondent and acts with **self-confidence**. If the interviewer gives the impression of being nervous or insecure, this does not provide confidence that is needed to obtain the respondent's co-operation, participation and attention.
- Comply with the order and format while asking questions from the questionnaire.
   In other words, comply strictly with instructions given. If you make modifications it can jeopardize the uniformity of information being collected across many areas and countries



#### INTERVIEW TECHNIQUE

If the interviewer gets tired or disturbed, or needs to interrupt the interview to attend to a business matter, **be co-operative**: allow a break in the interview, and then restart.

Do not give any information about which you are not sure; it is better to seem uninformed, but honest. Avoid any conversation or attitude which could lead to a discussion or argument with the respondent. Limit the conversation to the survey topics only.

**Do not make promises** or offer anything as an incentive for the respondent to participate in the survey

As far as possible, **do not** conduct the interview in **the presence of a person who is not the respondent**; the respondent may give different answers in presence of another person



#### INTERVIEW TECHNIQUE

Do not show surprise by any answer given by the respondent, either by the tone of your voice or your facial expression

At the end of the interview, **check** the questionnaire carefully to make sure that **no answer is missed** or entered in the wrong box

**Do not offer** copies of the questionnaire or any other material or anything else that the interviewer is not authorized to distribute

Leave the workplace **thanking the respondent(s)** for their cooperation in the survey, and the time and effort they invested





#### **COMPLETING THE QUESTIONNAIRE**

- Question: it is to be read to the respondent as it is written. Each question is numbered.
- **Answer modality or core**: these are possible answers. The interviewer selects answer code which is closest to the respondent's answer.
  - Many questions do not offer answers, but measure units to be used in the answer (for example: year, number of employees, salary in local currency, etc.)
- **Instruction for interviewer**: these are printed in Italic or CAPITAL letters, which facilitates survey implementation
- Skip patterns: Questions are normally asked in order one after another.
  However, in some cases, the given answer defines which question must be asked
  next, or which question is to be skipped. This will already be programmed in to
  the CAPI script.



#### **COMPLETING THE QUESTIONNAIRE**

- ✓ For questions where there is a **measure unit** specified, the interviewer should ask the respondent to give the answer in that unit.
- ✓ **Closed questions**: The question text is read and the answer must be chosen from the list of possible answers. In many cases, there is a category that says "other" and asks you to specify. In this example for Q4.19, we ask you to specify if the client type can not be categorized based on the given the list:

#### **COMPLETING THE QUESTIONNAIRE**

✓ Entering «0» as an Answer

If the question is about quantity (e.g. number of days, number of employees, etc.) zero is a possible answer and should be always entered if the respondent gives such an answer.

 Note: Zero (0) and BLANK are different: "0" means that the question was asked and the answer was "zero." BLANK means that the question was not asked

#### INTRODUCTION

"Hello, my name is [insert your name, from [Survey Firm], a consultancy hired by the World Bank] I am collecting data for a study that is trying to understand the creation and linkages for jobs in the [Product of Interest] Value Chain. The information gathered here will help develop new policies and programs to improve job creation.

Your establishment has been chosen randomly, along with several hundred others, to provide a representative sample of all farms/firms in the country/region. The information you will be providing will be treated as strictly confidential. Your farm/firm's name, your name, (your colleagues whom may be interviewed...) and the specific data collected will never be identifiable in any report or dataset. I will be asking questions on labor costs and activities, input structure and some other questions on [the product of interest]."



"I would like to begin by asking a few background questions"

This training module will cover both types of questions, for farms as well as for firms. As interviewers, you will need to recognize if you are visiting an agricultural facility or a non-agricultural enterprise and ask questions accordingly. The CAPI script will be written accordingly and will assist you!

When visiting a farm, you will ask "..for this farm.." and talk about crops, livestock and other activities on the farm within the most recent AGRICULTURAL year.

When visiting a firm, you will ask "..for this establishment.." and talk about products and other activities at on the firm. Within the most recent business year.



This questions asks the respondent to list the main sources of revenue at the farm or establishment. It is not necessary for the Value Chain Product/Activity of Interest to be among this list.




